Emilie Gleason was heavily inspired by her brother to tell strange stories about Ted's life. Introductions, conversations, love, sex and empathy don't come easily for this man with Asperger's syndrome.

While subject-specific graphic novels inspired by real-life abound, Emilie Gleason transcends her subject to bring us a supercharged work that races at a hundred miles an hour and is packed with shocks and surprises. The book is much more than a report or a testimony; vtruly immerses the reader in an unusual character. From the first pages, it provides a singular reading experience, the storm of colour and energy reflecting the vibrant protagonist.

Émilie Gleason was born in 1992 in France from a Belgium mother and a Mexican father. She studied comics & illustration at the HEAR (Strasbourg). Believe it or not: Ted drôle de coco is her first book.
